

## Spring slip-sliding away

The Iowa high school golf state tournaments are a little over a month away, but Charles City High School's golf teams have yet to hit the links in regular season competition.

The new Comet soccer team has seen more games cancelled that it has played.

The Charles City Y scrapped its first Saturday of youth soccer games at the College Grounds.

A winter that will not go away is upending not only spring sports, its also extending the school year for some. On April 12, the Charles City district announced that the final day of school on Friday, May 25, which was scheduled to be a shortened day will now be a full day.

"It's important to note that weather days can still be called and the final day of school will remain flexible well into May," the announcement said.

Another winter storm was forecast for Wednesday, April 18. The National Weather Service warned of 4 to 8 inches of snow accumulation for Floyd and Chickasaw counties.

As of Tuesday, April 17, Charles City's observed snow depth was 2 inches, according to NWS data. That is a record for the date on which the normal depth is zilch. Normally, the entire month of April in Charles City sees 2.2 inches of total snowfall.

Chances are good that another daily record will be set Wednesday, because the largest reported snowfall for April 18 was a "trace" amount that arrived in 1967.
